Pilot International released the new and improved Pilot International Website at convention. Each club president will be sent the password to share with club members. Pilot International revealed the newest BrainMinder Buddy. Tiana Tiger focuses on proper nutrition and diet for optimum brain health. This new BM buddy offers opportunities to partner with nutrition programs, the extension service as well as other programs that promote healthy eating.

Alabama was well represented by our Anchors. During the 'Pilots Have Talent' several Alabama Anchors along with their sponsors as well as Cathy Ellison, District Anchor Leader, donned Chicken Hats and joined the Pilots in the Alabama version of the Chicken Dance. Anchor District President, Caroline Smith, sang the beautiful song "Defying Gravity" from WICKED the Musical.

On Saturday morning during President Rhona's Breakfast Tea, Geneva Anchor Shannen Lloyd was called to the stage to model her fascinator, the best of them all. As awards were given out, the Guntersville Middle School Anchor Club was recognized as Anchor Club of the Year for clubs with over 41 members, and first Place in the Anchor Community Service/Pick-Me-Ups for clubs over 41. The Guntersville High School Anchor Club earned 2nd place for Anchor Club of the Year for clubs under 40 and third place in the Anchor Community/Pick-Me-Ups Award.

Anchors, Navigators and Pilots all participated in the convention service project assembling 3000 hygiene packs for area youth in partnership with Bellevue LifeSpring. Alabama clubs and individual Pilots donated \$550 to help fund this project.

Hello Alabama Pilots! As the summer ends and children head back to school, Alabama District Pilots also get back into the swing of a new Pilot year. I really enjoyed the Pilot International (PI) Convention in Bellevue and would like to share with you the new PI initiative: One Matters.

One Matters is an initiative which challenges every Pilot Member to ask at least one person to join Pilot this year. The optimum time to do so would be at the Share Pilot meeting so that you would have the best opportunity to share what Pilot does, and therefore have a greater chance that they will join. For every member that successfully gets a new member, if you attend the PI Convention, your name will be put in a drawing. If your name is drawn, your registration fee will be refunded. If your new member attends the PI Convention, their name will be put in the drawing as well. If every person brought in a new member, we could double in size! Imagine the people we could serve with twice the membership.

There is one more part to the One Matters: It is called 250 by 2025. To become a District, you must have 250 members. There are Districts below 250, and other Districts that are close. Given that we are working hard to recruit new members, we have until 2025 to bring the numbers up. At that time, if there are Districts below 250, the PI Executive Board will look at the best way to merge Districts to accomplish an appropriate size.
