Ask questions about the responsibilities and the role of the position, rather than just saying no. You may be surprised that the position is not as daunting as you may have thought it was. So step up and serve your District with pride, accept your nomination or appointment and instill fresh, new ideas for the 2023-2024 Pilot year! After accepting the nomination, District Officer candidates will need to complete paperwork that is due 60 days prior to your District Convention.

March 15, 2023 is an important date in the Pilot books! Circle it on your calendar. It is the deadline for the 2023 Scholarship Applications and a quarterly deadline for Helmet and Pick Me Up Grant Applications. The Pilot International Founders Fund awards scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students seeking an education in one of Pilot's focus areas. Several scholarships are awarded to students that have been active Anchors during their high school career. Pacesetters, 250 Clubs, and 250 Members are recognitions that Pilot International uses to identify clubs and members for their financial generosity. To be recognized as a Pacesetter Club, the club donates \$10 per member. To be recognized as a 250 Club or 250 Member, the club or member has to contribute at least \$250 to the Grants and Scholarships Fund. All contributions must be postmarked by February 1 to be recognized at District Conventions.
