Here are a few steps to having a successful Share Pilot Event.

Set a Date, Time, Location, Theme and Menu (create a sign-up sheet for food)

- 1. Create Invites Encourage everyone to bring 2 or more guests. (Make paper and electronic invites.)
- 2. Create a Program (What is your message going to be? Why I AM a Pilot!) Ask current members to share why they are a member of The Pilot Club. Share what we do! Explain what the expectation of a Pilot Member is. You will only get out of Pilot, what you put into Pilot!
- 3. Have membership packets available at Share Pilot. Create a form for potential members so we can follow up with them after the event.
