BRUSH UP ON RULES OF ORDER, CONVENTION IS COMING!

In the most recent Pilot Log, our international parliamentarian Maryann Frazer reminded us that Robert's Rules of Order were created to allow every member of a group to have a turn to be heard in an orderly fashion. That is exactly what we hope to accomplish at the Alabama District Convention.

TIPS TO ACCOMPLISH THIS

- □ LISTEN TO THE OPINIONS OF OTHERS WHEN IT IS THEIR TURN TO TALK. Listening means "ears opened, mouth closed."
- ∏ SPEAK CLEARLY AND DISTINCTLY WHEN IT'S YOUR
 TURN TO SPEAK. OBSERVE THE TIME LIMITS SET BY
 THE CONVENTION BODY.
 Stand, Address the Chair, identify yourself and your
 club so everyone knows you have reason to speak.
 Limit comments to no more than 3 minutes and
 realize that you can only speak twice on each
 separate issue.
- Π IF YOU FEEL A MOTION NEEDS TO BE AMENDED, SEND YOUR IDEA IN WRITING TO THE HEAD TABLE. This helps both the presiding officer and the secretary taking minutes.
- ∏ REMEMBER, BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE
 CONVENTION BODY HAS BEEN SENT TO THE CLUBS
 60 DAYS BEFORE THE CONVENTION TO SHARE WITH
 THEIR MEMBERS. CLUBS SHOULD STUDY IT AND
 FORM THEIR OPINIONS TO SHARE WITH THEIR CLUB
 DELEGATES.
 Other ideas will need to go through the chain of
 command for next convention.
- HELP KEEP BUSINESS MOVING BY OFFERING MOTIONS OR SECONDS QUICKLY AND IN ORDER. Again, stand, address the Chair, identify yourself, then make the motion or second and return to your seat.

QUICK OBSERVANCE OF BASIC COURTESY WILL GET BUSINESS CONDUCTED EFFICIENTLY ALLOWING THE CONVENTION BODY TO MOVE ON TO OTHER ACTIVITIES AND ENDEAVORS.
